

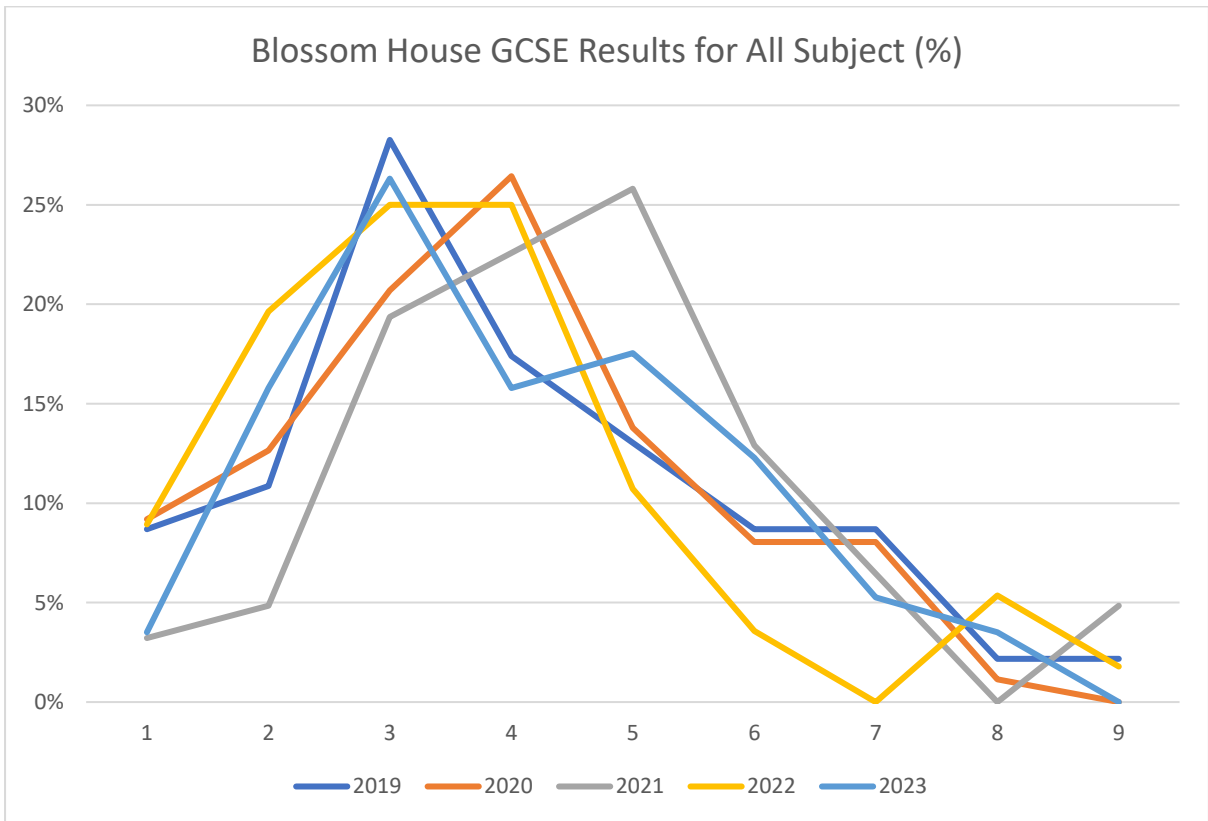
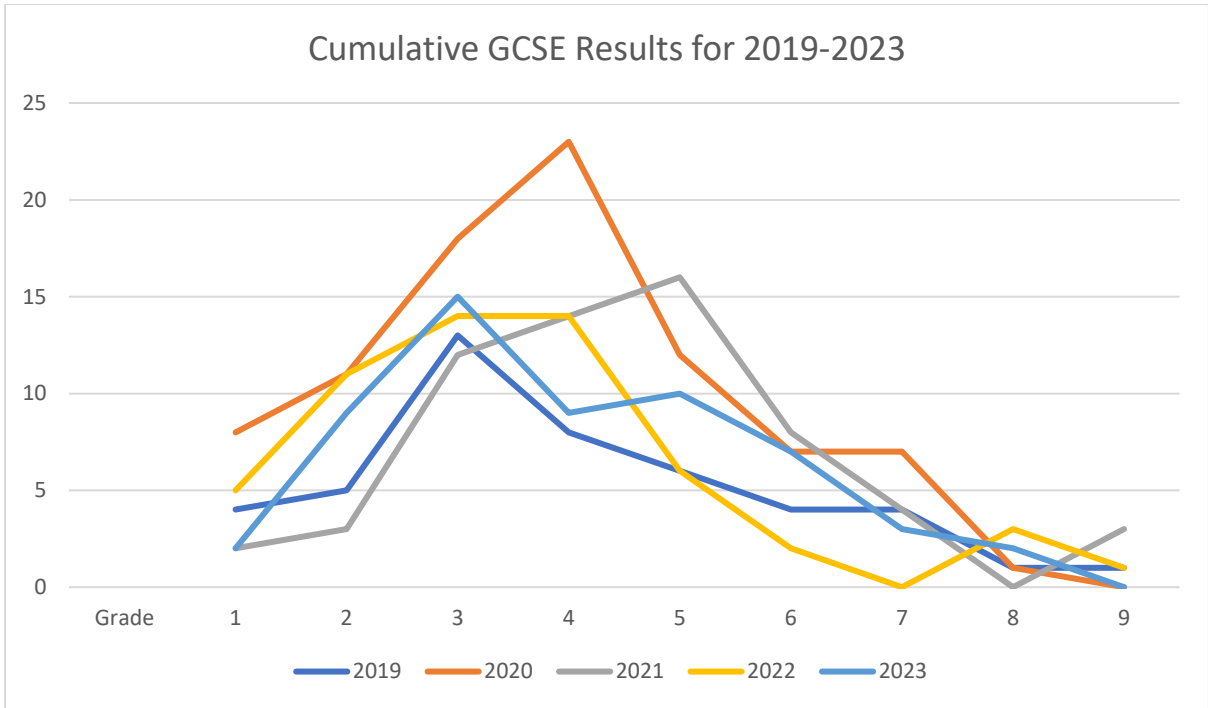
Blossom House School GCSE Data 2023

- Art and Photography produced high grades.

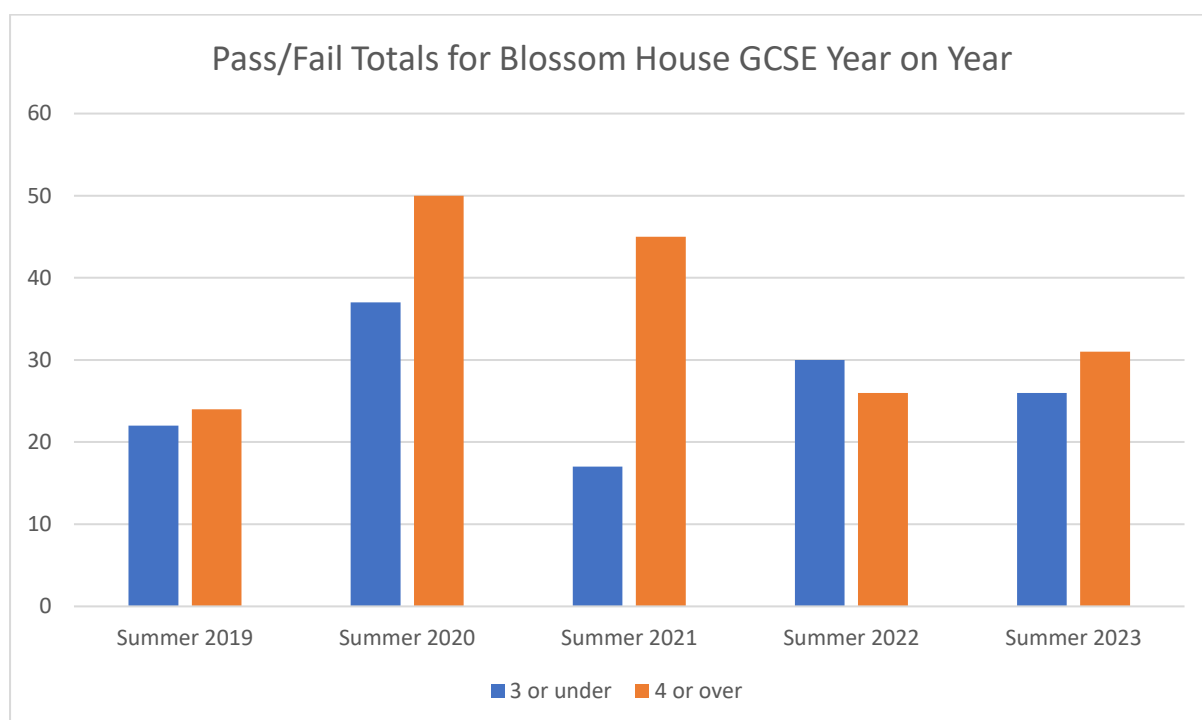

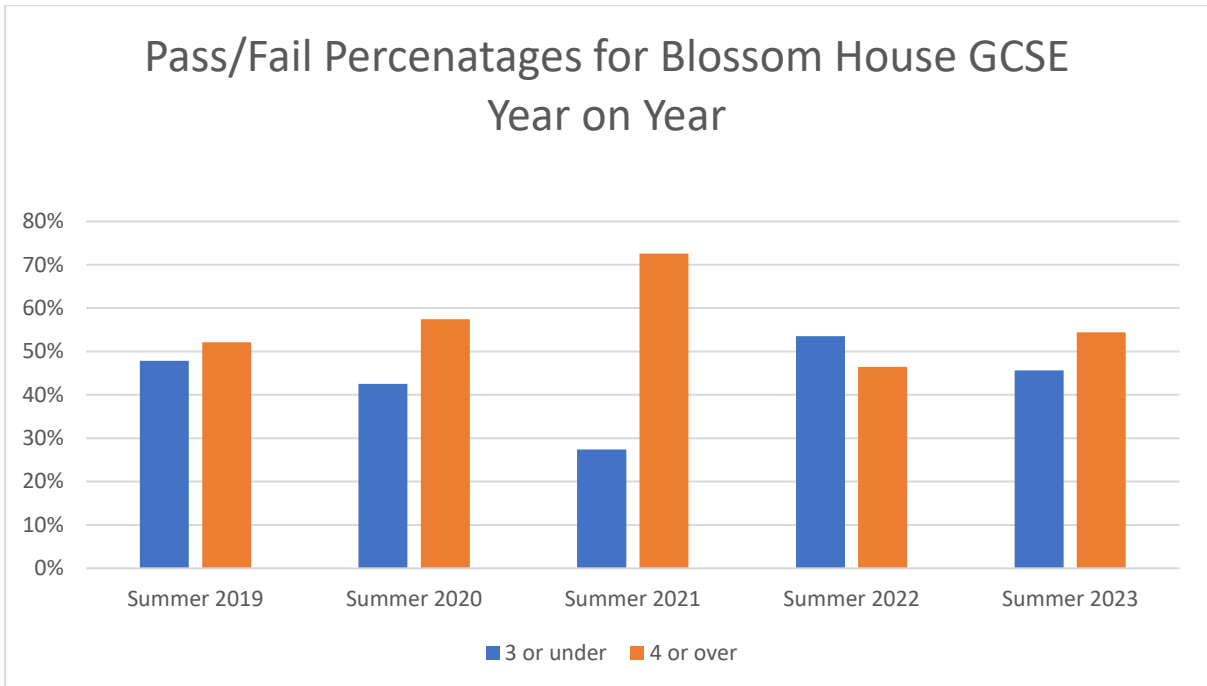
- The light blue line on the following graphs represents the 2023 data.
- It shows a consistency within the bell-curve in relation to the previous 5-year results.



- The following tables and graphs show the pass and fail ratios from 2019-2023
- 2019, and data for the years before that are not shown, portray a delicate balance between pass-fail
- 2020 saw a large swing toward students passing with 57.46% achieving 4 or above and in 2021, it increased dramatically with 72.58% achieving a 4 or above.
- These were the teacher assessed grades which, as seen nationally, saw an increased pass rate.
- 2022 and 2023, saw a return to the pre-pandemic balance with 46.43%-53.57% and 45.61%-54.39% respectively.
- 2023 did see a greater number of GCSEs passed than failed.
